## Agricultural Commission

The Sugar on Snow Supper on March 12<sup>th</sup> was an even bigger success than last year. Thanks to everyone who contributed with donations, time, labor, and attendance at the event. Rita's Famous Shepherd's Pie wowed 'em again, and there were increased requests for the ground lamb version of the meal. Special thanks to

Mark and Kristin of Leyden Glen Farm for the ground lamb. The ground beef again came from Jeff Niepp's Castle Hill Farm and the fresh lettuce was donated by Tom Ashley's Dancing Bear Farm. So in terms of showcasing agricultural products from right here in Leyden, it was a spectacular success. The maple syrup came from Franklin Farm (the trees are in Leyden) and that special snow from East Hill.

## Board of Health

The Board of Health is required to issue food permits to any organization that is planning to serve food for sale to the public. Please submit your yearly calendar of planned events to the Leyden Board of Health so that we can issue your organization a permit, free of charge, which will be good for one year.

State law mandates that vendors serving food to the public have a Serve Safe certificate posted at the function. Hopefully, someone at your organization already has this.

The Leyden Board of Health will be moving our office into the Police Station sometime in March. Our meetings on the second Tuesday of the month at 5:30 PM will also move to the Police Station starting with the April meeting. This move will free up our old office in the Town Hall for the Town Clerk's use and allow him to have his file cabinets in his office, while allowing us to have our file cabinets handy for us during meetings. The Board of Health would like to thank Chief Dan Galvis for coming up with the solution to both situations. Also we wish to thank the Selectboard for acting on our needs in a timely manner. A great big thank you to David Brooks for donating his time to move all the file cabinets. Please continue to call the same numbers for Board of Health issues, 774-4111 (Town Hall) or 774-7113 (Gloria Fisher, chair) Your local board of health continuing to work for a safe community.

## Thanks to the Highway Crew


Dear Leyden Road Crew,

## Wired West News

Signs of Spring are starting to appear, but the most noticeable in our household was the buzz of the phone lines due to the heavy rains. After a call to Verizon, and a couple of days with intermittent phone service, and consequently no dial-up, our service was restored. Imagine having dependable phone service all the time. This is just another reason to pursue the Wired West initiative.

The Massachusetts Broadband Map for the Town of Leyden was updated and returned to MBI. Thank you to everyone we talked to. After lots of phone calls and voice mail messages, we filled in as much information as possible about the availability of DSL through Verizon. It was a little disheartening for those of us without DSL, to see the number of homes having access. Especially so when, in some cases, you can see your neighbors' houses, and they have access but you don't. Verizon is not interested in expanding their service. Did you know that the broadband Verizon brought into Leyden was already obsolete? We've recently learned that the hill towns received recycled wire that was pulled from the Boston area. This is yet another reason to be sure that all Leyden residents have choices when it comes to their internet access.

We will be attending an MBI meeting on March 19<sup>th</sup>, and hope to have more updates. We understand that all of the environmental groundwork has been completed and they are in the process of getting permits for work on existing poles. The work will be done by Verizon, etc., but for MBI and with all their guidelines. When they are done with that work (it must be done within 2 – 2 ½ years), the fiber optic cable will be within 3 miles of 98% of all the residences, businesses, schools and anchor institutions in the area involved. They are also in discussion with providers who might want to use the lines to bring us the services we need. Once again, this initiative is all about having choices for all of the residents of Leyden! Think Spring!


