Select Board

October proved to be an eventful month in the Town. The First Bob Cook Memorial Tractor Pull, The Historical Commission’s annual South Cemetery Tour, COA Luncheons and coffees, art, and exercise classes, and clean-up of Avery Field facilitates.

Lt. Governor Kayrn Polito visited Leyden on October 17th to receive an update on our progress toward boardband availability. Bill and Lance conducted their annual drive-about-town tour, and Sue Howarth and the Recreation Committee put on a Halloween party for the kids. The Selectboard extends our heartfelt thanks to all those who work so hard to make all of these events a success.

The planned November Special Town Meeting has been postponed until January 15, 2018. I would like to close the warrant early in December to give the Finance Committee time to review it. Citizens wishing to have items added to the warrant should submit their petitions to Bob Hardesty by the end of November. If there are questions concerning the requirements

Proposed Leyden Safety Bylaw

The Leyden Citizens Safety Petition and proposed bylaw appear to indicate the Town of Leyden is unsafe. There is no evidence to support this, nor is there any evidence the Town is under any hunting pressure. Over the last 30 years, hunting has decreased in Town for multiple reasons—young people having no interest, declining population of older hunters, extended length of seasons, expense of sport, properties already posted, etc.

Carlisle was mentioned in the October newsletter and they are a good example of a Safety bylaw failure.

In July 1992 they adopted a similar bylaw as proposed in Leyden. In 2017 they have a Deer committee and a Lyme Disease Subcommittee. They not only have a deer population problem, but they are a hotbed for Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases (the latter being on their own Board of Health web page).

In 2002 their deer population was triple what was considered healthy; 20 to 30 deer per square mile, when 8 was the optimal amount. Currently, according to Deer Management at mass.gov, deer densities range from 10-15 deer per square mile in Northwestern Massachusetts to more than 80 deer per square mile in areas of Eastern Massachusetts (ex: Carlisle) closed to hunting.

They effectively shut down all hunting in their community. That was their intention, and now they must deal with the consequences. There could be the argument that maybe some hunting was allowed, but checking hunting blogs there was one that indicated “good luck trying to get written permission in Carlisle.”

It seems redundant to adopt yet another bylaw when current state regulations are sufficient and serve everyone fairly. Massachusetts has strict hunting regulations and experience in wildlife management; they are the experts. As a landowner you can post notices requiring written permission or you can choose not to. It's very simple: The existing regulations are in place so everyone has the opportunity to manage their *own property* as they desire.

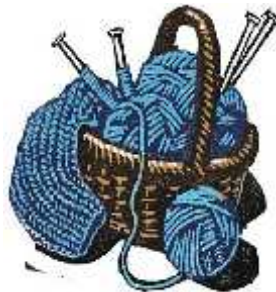


