
Holiday Arts and Crafts Fairs

Just a quick reminder that the Right-to-Farm bylaw adopted by the Town requires that new buyers or renters must be made aware that Leyden



is a right-to-farm community. The responsibility for notification falls upon the present owner. Notification forms are available at the Select Board office, and should be part of the sales closing or rental process, signed by the new owner or occupant, and returned to the office to be filed with the property record. We've noticed several for-sale signs around town, and this requirement often gets overlooked in the crunch of closing. It's good for all concerned, and your cooperation is greatly appreciated! The Ag Com will not meet in November or December. The next regularly scheduled meeting is <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>January 3rd</u> to begin planning the annual Sugar on Snow supper in March.

PVRS Land Management

What ideas do you have about the future of Pioneer Valley Regional High School's 84 acres?

The Pioneer Valley Regional School District approved a plan to initiate development of a resilient land management plan. Such a plan will include baseline assessment for possible conditions that could cause major ecosystem shifts from natural and human initiated disturbances, such as climate change and diminishing natural resources.

Additionally, it will provide management recommendations for on-site community / local food security with permaculture / edible forest gardens, invasive plant management, hiking/cross country trails that connect the region, and strategies of using landscape to reduce dependency on fossil fuels.
