The generosity of patrons and Leyden residents who helped to raise \$350 to qualify for the **Libri Foundation Grant** has been overwhelming. Donations exceeded \$700! I have submitted the titles chosen by teachers and await the arrival of \$1500 worth of books for the young ones (Pre-K through Grade 6). Thank you, all!

The balance of these donations has been deposited into a **special events fund** for the library, and it will definitely allow us to continue our Summer Reading Program's gift certificates to participants as well as to support other activities we plan for our young people and for the population in general.

In addition to the money budgeted by the town to run the RML, another source of money that allows us to maintain our library is state aid. It was reduced by about fifty percent several years ago. This year we expect another major reduction. So far we are holding our own; let's hope things improve in time.

We are looking forward to another **Summer Reading Program** commencing on May 21st and ending on September 7th. On the 21st, PRES students will visit the library, sign up for the program and take out their first books. Parents are encouraged to visit the RML often so that visiting the library is a positive experience for the town's young people. Participants may read books from home and from other libraries, however. The goal is to engage kids in reading for pleasure all summer long! Their comprehension, speed and enjoyment of reading will truly be enhanced, and each participant will qualify for a gift certificate to the World Eye Book Shop. This reading program is open to all Leyden young people, tiny tots through high school.

Our new railing is in the works as students at PVRs work with their instructor, John Passiglia, to create a very special wrought iron railing to grace our entrance. Johan Livingstone will install it. It should be here by the end of May.

A special thank you is extended to Holly Spatcher for her donation of delightful flowers to grace our window boxes, *again*. It is so nice that these plants come from Leyden and a patron of the RML. Your generosity is greatly appreciated, Holly!

CHANGES FOR SCHOOL AND FOOD

This is an update regarding the Federal Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 and the Massachusetts School Nutrition Standards Law. Every school community has to participate in this together to meet the requirements of the law. *Beginning with the new 2012 school year any food offered during the day must comply with this law.*

How will this affect food families and teachers bring in to school for students? Celebrations with cakes, sweets, and candy cannot take place beginning in August 2012 for the new school year. This includes what families bring in for birthdays, what teachers bring in for students, and what families and teachers bring in for the teachers' room treats. This is not a PVRSD policy, but the new law implementation.

There was a suggestion made that perhaps PTOs could do a fundraiser creating a cookbook that has snacks that meet the new legislation.

How will this affect fundraisers? Fundraisers that sell candy, Butterbraids, and other foods that do not meet the new nutritional standards may not be sold between the times of 30 minutes before school begins to 30 minutes after school ends.

Payments for lunches need to take place ahead of time, before student meals are taken, beginning in August 2012. Every cafeteria will accept cash or checks, and you even have the option of paying a week or a month in advance. We hope that having this information now will help you to plan ahead. Any current debts for lunches must be paid in full by the end of the school year.

EARLY RELEASE SCHEDULE

The District is considering changes to the elementary schools' professional development/early release schedule for next year. Part of the reason is to have the elementary schools' and PVRs' schedules aligned. We think it will be helpful to families to adopt a schedule that is consistent and dependable throughout the year for all PVRSD students. We would change the current model of having half-day releases on Friday afternoons for ten days (in addition to the Wednesday before Thanksgiving and the last day of school) throughout the school year. Instead, we are considering more frequent early release days of a shorter duration (for example, a 1:45 dismissal two times per month or every week). To plan effectively for any proposed change, we want to consider the impact of any potential change on families. As we continue with our planning, we will provide an opportunity for you to weigh in.

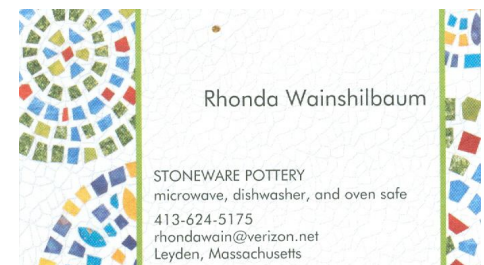

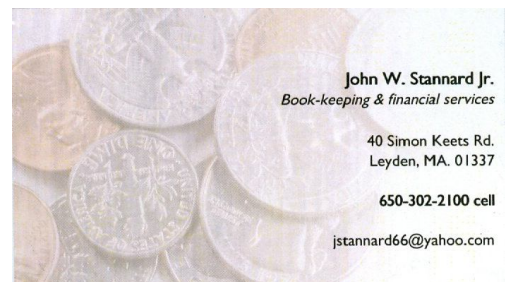
