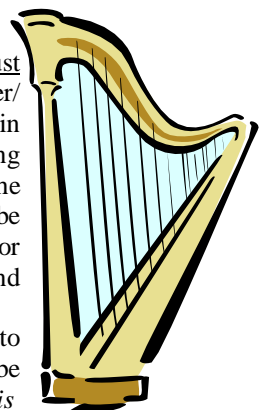

On-Line Tax Payment is Here Now!

You are now able to pay your Leyden real estate, personal property and motor vehicle excise taxes on line through a service called "Unipay."

To use the service, go to the Town of Leyden web sight at townofleyden.com. Under the Tax Collector heading you will find a link that says "Pay Taxes Online."

First choose which type of tax you want to pay (in the upper left corner), then choose one of two options for method of payment. *Please read the options*, i.e., Electronic Check or Credit Card. There is no fee when you pay by electronic check. Credit cards have fees attached, based on the amount of the bill. There is a fee schedule at the bottom of the page where you can find the fee amounts. These amounts will be totaled with the amount of tax.

You will only be able to pay your bills on line when they are current. Any past due amounts will have to be paid in the office.

SCHOOL LUNCH GUIDELINES

The Pioneer Valley Regional School District is committed to working with families while meeting the expectations of the Federal Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 and the Massachusetts School Nutrition Standards to ensure that all school age children have adequate nourishment. Research has conclusively associated proper nourishment with a child's ability to learn.

The majority of the Massachusetts School Nutrition Standards will be in place by August of 2012. This will include changes in school lunches in regards to food content and offerings, as well as payment guidelines for families.

Our PVRSD School Meals Program operates on a non-profit basis and is not supported by the operating budget. Its budget comes from daily revenues and state and federal subsidies. *We encourage our families to complete an application for free or reduced meals.* Taking the time to fill out and submit this application has a great impact on how the Pioneer Valley Regional School District qualifies for additional State and Federal funds, which includes grants.

Current Guidelines: *You must pay for your child's/children's meals in advance or the day they eat or ahead of time.* Pre-payments may be made by cash or check to your child's school cafeteria. Only when your child eats breakfast or lunch will the money be deducted from his/her "account".

Pioneer Valley Regional School: High School students are presumed to be responsible enough to have money to purchase meals with them daily, or have a balance on their account. Non-payment of meals (breakfast or lunch) may not exceed \$12.50. Then parents/guardians will be notified by the cafeteria manager or school personnel to submit payment to clear any negative balance in their account. *The district can no longer allow the charging of lunches for an extended period of time without payment.*

Bernardston, Northfield, and Pearl Rhodes Elementary, Warwick Community School: Non-payment of meals (breakfast or lunch) may not exceed \$12.50. Then parents/guardians will be notified by the cafeteria manager or school personnel to submit payment to clear any negative balance in their account. *The district can no longer allow the charging of lunches for an extended period of time without payment.*


