January kicks off **Robertson Memorial Library's Centennial Celebration**. In honor of our library's 100^{th} year, join us for "What Leyden is Reading." Each month the library will have a short selection available for people to read and discuss.* We hope the selection will be both entertaining and enlightening for a family discussion around the dinner table or a comment or two on the library's web page. It's a great way to have a common topic for conversation or some read-out-loud time together as a family. So shut off the TV, pull off the ear "buds," pull up a chair, and find out "What Leyden is Reading."

January's selection comes from *Lives of the Presidents: Fame, Shame (and What the Neighbors Thought)* by Kathleen Krull and Kathryn Hewitt (pp.51-2). Since Barack Obama will be inaugurated in January, we'll start our reading celebration with a few pages about the US President of 100 years ago, Woodrow Wilson. Like Obama, Wilson was a two-term President, from 1913 to 1921. He was a professor, president of Princeton University, governor of New Jersey and leader of the U.S. during WWI. What month was he inaugurated? Was Edith Wilson, his second wife, in fact our first woman president? You'll find it interesting to discover how things were done back then. Enjoy!
