Select Board Corner

New Faces: Kris Nartowicz was appointed Town Treasurer on August 2, 2012. Kris has an Associate's Degree in Accounting from GCC. She has been the Treasurer in Heath since June of 2003 and full time in the accounting area at Sandri since 1998. The Treasurer serves as the municipality's cash manager. In this role, the Treasurer maintains custody of all municipal funds and is responsible for the deposit, investment and disbursement of these monies. The treasurer plays a principal role in municipal borrowing, manages tax title accounts and superintends tax foreclosure proceedings.

Tax Collection: The Town of Leyden has quarterly property tax bills. Mailings are sent twice a year, each containing two quarterly bills. When mailing tax information to a property owner, the Collector receives an affidavit of mailing and has certified the time of the sending of the tax bills (State Tax Form 214) and the date the bills are given into the custody of the post office. The post office records its attestation of the receipt of the bills and the date of the receipt on the original affidavit. The Collector has that affidavit notarized and filed with the Town Clerk, retaining a copy for the collector's files. If the property owner has moved, it is his/her responsibility to notify the Tax Collector. The property owner is responsible for the

payment of his/her tax bill and any interest and penalties even if the bill was not received, as long as the bill was mailed to the best address on record. Tax bills are due in the Collector's office on the due date. Postmarks are not considered. These policies are established by the Massachusetts General Laws on taxation and are not determined by the Town.

The Town is now using the law firm of Berenson & Bloom to collect unpaid taxes on real estate in tax title. In addition, Arthur P. Jones Associates, Inc. will be serving as a Deputy Collector to collect unpaid excise and personal property taxes. Interest is charged on all delinquent taxes, and the fees/costs for collection are further added to the taxes owed. Once a property is in tax title the contact person is the Treasurer, not the Collector.

Property is valued by the Board of Assessors, not the Tax Collector. If you have questions about property valuation, please contact the Board of Assessors. In addition, it is the property owners' responsibility to periodically check to make sure the assessors have the correct information about the property – acreage, out buildings, dimensions of buildings etc. —Select Board
