Landscape Partnership Program

Throughout last summer, our neighbors around Bree-Z-Knoll Farm worked with the Town, Franklin Land Trust, and Mount Grace Land Conservation Trust to create the "Leyden Working Farms and Forests Conservation Partnership" to protect our working lands and scenic natural areas. We applied for grant funding through the State's new "Landscape Partnership Program." In March, we found out that we were awarded the grant! By the end of next summer, we'll be able to conserve 800 acres here in Leyden, including Bree-Z-Knoll Farm. The landowners will still own the land, but each property will be protected with a Conservation Restriction (CR). Our neighbors will continue to farm, do forestry, and maintain trails on their land, while paying property taxes at the Chapter 61 "current use" rates, just like they do today. We'll be able to guarantee that this neighborhood will always be rural.

The State-funded grant works as a reimbursement program where the land trusts and the Town need to buy the CRs first. Collectively, the landowners are generously gifting 50% of the total CR acquisition costs to make this initiative happen. The land trusts have agreed to front nearly \$850,000 to cover the purchase of five CRs. At the Annual Town Meeting next month, we'll be asking Leyden residents to join the partnership by voting to authorize the Town to borrow up to \$350,000 to purchase the CRs on five additional properties. The Town will then be reimbursed by the Grant, and the interest costs will be funded by another source.

As part of this grant, the Town would also be reimbursed for working with a consultant to develop a new, natural resource-based zoning bylaw. The bylaw itself would be voted on in the May 2014 Town Meeting, but this year we'll vote to see if the Town will approve spending money to hire a consultant.

Council on Aging Needs Your Participation

The 2004 Town of Leyden Community Development Plan noted "The number of elderly residents aged 65 and over is expected to more than double, reaching 138 people total by 2025. The 2012 census data show:

Clearly, Leyden's population is aging, and with that aging comes numerous needs: increased health care, transportation, social activities, intergenerational contact and fun, assistance in obtaining the best Medicare gap insurance, perhaps assistance with financial affairs, obtaining healthful meals and so on. One source of meeting some of these needs is the Council on Aging.

This year the COA has been run by four women volunteers – two in the first six months and two in the second six months. While in total agreement with the Town's need, none of the four is able to continue this effort. It is time for an eight- to ten-member Council on Aging that can divide the effort into parts and begin to enable a stronger and more viable program for our growing elderly population. Both Colrain and Bernardston have strong programs and strong support from their town governments. Both have been visited and both have agreed to help Leyden develop a strong program.

This article is to inform you and request volunteers to form the COA and develop the needed program and resources for our elderly population. The four volunteers this year all qualified as elderly under the "55 years and over" definition of the COA. Most of the volunteers in both the Colrain and Bernardston COA efforts were elderly and all of them were joyful and excited about the program and the work being done.




