Continued from Page 1 respondent, the more emphatic is the answer.

We are an aging population, with a diminishing growth rate, which makes all of our taxes rise. Selling our homes, or seeing their value increase for our children, will be much more difficult without a good Internet connection. As residents, most of us can't even attract our own children to live here without access to the best internet connection, even though they love Leyden. The need to be connected increases almost by the day, and that will only speed up.

Even those who think they will never need it may be surprised by even the medical advantages we will see very soon, allowing us to live longer and more independently in our homes. Towns with lots of second-home owners report that those owners would often love to move there permanently and improve their homes (increasing the tax base) but can't do it without being able to work from home. I don't know how many of you have ever seen the pamphlet in Town Hall that lists businesses in Leyden. There are 33 listed there, and there are probably more that are not listed. That is a substantial base of people who desperately need to be connected, and will absolutely grow when we have fiber optic available to use.

All of this would increase our tax base and the viability of our town. If you have filled out the support card, helping us to be among those towns who will get connected earlier, thank you. If you have not yet signed the card at wiredwest.net, please consider it. You can call me at 774-5922 if you would like me to do it for you. This is important for Leyden's future.

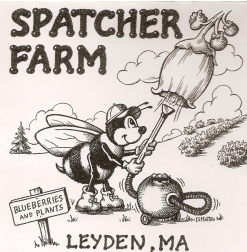
