Selectboard Corner

In the last couple of months we've had some issues regarding the Town Hall, and it has turned our attention to looking at all the town buildings and assessing what might be needed in the future. Upkeep of these buildings is a major concern; we need to lay out some future capital plans. We had to replace the water heater in the town hall, and in anticipation of updating the kitchen, we opted to put in a larger water heater. A couple years back the well pump was replaced and we were advised to put on a water filter, so it is now installed.

With the recent rain storms, we've noticed that the roof is leaking in several places in Town Hall. Jeff and Bill inspected the attic area where the water was coming in, and Dave Brooks patched the outside. The roof is in bad shape and probably upwards of 45 to 50 years old. Anyone who has any information on when that roof was put on please contact Bob Hardesty at the town hall. We are in the process now of seeking estimates in what it will take to replace the roof on Town Hall. We are going to put a log book together with a file for all seven town buildings, and keep a record of any maintenance that takes place for future reference.

Last year the Finance Committee requested a capital plan for the Town and that report has been sent to them. We recently met with the Building Needs Study Committee, and they also have that report. In the coming months the Selectboard, along

with the Finance Committee and the Building Needs Study Committee will look at some of the needs of the town and work out a path so any capital projects will be done over time.

We cannot ignore the fact that these buildings need some investment. You will see more detail as we move forward and present this at our Annual Town Meeting. The recent blueberry supper was proof that our kitchen is worth updating to continue these great community gatherings.

Thank you everyone who was in the kitchen for a great job, and thanks to Bill Maguire for power washing the playground equipment at PRES prior to the opening of school.

At our Annual Town Meeting we passed Article 20 and appropriated \$2,959.00 to join the Greenfield Veterans Services District. Our Veterans Agent, Charles Loven, has retired and I recently met our new Veterans Service Director, Tim Niejadlik. He mentioned that any veteran seeking help should call his office at 413-772-1571. We are grateful that Charlie has agreed to stay on as Leyden's representative to represent us at the district meetings. Any Leyden veteran should maintain a copy of DD Form 214 as this form is needed when seeking help from the Director.

As reported last month, the Leyden Council on Aging (COA) is happy to announce that **Dianne Cornwell** has been appointed as the Seniors Activities Coordinator for this coming year. She is working with the Council on Aging and interested residents in bringing activities, services and programs that will benefit residents ages 50 and over in our community.

On Monday, October 21st, from 10:30 AM to 12:00 NOON, Dianne will be at Town Hall to meet with residents in person to hear what programs they are interested in. Please come and welcome her. She will bring Nancy Wood with her, the Outreach Coordinator for the town of Bernardston, who will be coming to Leyden once a month to provide information about programs and services available to Leyden residents. Nancy has many years of experience working with people, coordinating benefits, and helping people get referrals to services and finding resolutions to problems.

Also on October 21st, from 10:30 to 11:00 AM, there will be an information session on Fuel Assistance for this coming heating season. Nancy will give an overview of the program, eligibility requirements, and will work with interested residents in completing an application. Keep in mind that applications will be acted upon beginning in November, and applying sooner is always better! We hope to see you there!

On Monday, October 28th, from 10:30 AM to 12:00 NOON, SHINE Counselor Dianne Ryan will be available at Town Hall to meet with residents. SHINE is a Medicare-sponsored service that provides objective and impartial information on health insurance plans for people with Medicare. Medicare's Open Enrollment begins October 15th and ends December 7th, with changes taking effect on January 1, 2014. Every Medicare subscriber should take the time to review his or her insurance plan. Dianne will review the basics of open enrollment and answer general questions. Individual appointments can be set up at that time if needed.

A social time with a light lunch of soup and sandwiches will be offered at 11:45, after both of the above sessions. Interested persons should call Bob Hardesty at Town Hall (774-4111) and let him know if they will attend the lunch, so we have an approximate number.

On Thursday, October 10th, at 1:00 PM, Richard Clark will perform "Atticus" at Town Hall. This one-hour, one-man show is a dramatization of Harper Lee's famous novel "To Kill a Mockingbird". With its combination of history, courtroom drama, and the tender story of a father raising his young children, Richard's version of the story has been acclaimed by many audiences. The performance is open to adults of all ages. Light refreshments will be served.

Continued from Page 1 Regional Planner with the DCR Division of Water supply Protection. Jeff will make a PowerPoint presentation on the process of developing an Open Space Residential Design or Natural Resource Protection Zoning Bylaw. As a consultant, Jeff has been involved with many Planning Boards in the development of this zoning bylaw. The zoning bylaw in his hometown of Shutesbury, which Jeff helped develop has become the state's model. The Leyden Selectboard voted to go through the Open Space Residential Design or Natural Resource Protection Zoning Bylaw process, which assisted Leyden in obtaining the Commonwealth Landscape Partnership Grant.

Leyden obtained the grant and voted at Annual Town Meeting, Article 18, to accept the sum of \$8,000.00 for the purpose of obtaining technical assistance to develop an Open Space Residential Design or Natural Resource Protection Zoning Bylaw, to be reimbursed by the Commonwealth Landscape Partnership Program. This bylaw will be presented and voted on at our next Annual Town Meeting. This Public Forum on October 1st provides an opportunity for all residents to understand how this zoning bylaw process impacts them individually and as a town.

There will be another **Public Forum on**Tuesday, October 8th at 7:00 PM at Town Hall

presented by Linda Dunlavy, Executive

Director of the Franklin Regional Council of

Governments (FRCOG). Linda will review the

FRCOG programs currently used by Leyden and
other programs not currently being used, which
we might want to consider. This will also be an
opportunity to learn what we get for the money
we spend and to learn how to best utilize each
program. Please take this opportunity to
understand the programs you are asked to vote
for at Town Meeting.

Leyden will soon have fireproof lockable file cabinets, donated to the town, to secure irreplaceable documents. A huge thanks to Dan Galvis and Dave Brooks in advance for their efforts to organize and safely bring these heavy file cabinets to Leyden. Thanks also to Dave Brooks and Ed Klaus for trimming the huge tree overhanging the slide at Pearl Rhodes School.

Please be aware that the Animal Control Bylaw will be in effect as of October 13th. (This is the deadline to clear the Attorney General's office, which we fully expect to take place.) If you have not obtained licenses for your dog(s) and secured them on your property, avoid fines by getting into compliance now.


Leyden United Methodist Church
