in other important town business. Numerous calls have been placed to Shelburne control where the police have spent a sum of taxpayer money chasing down unlicensed dogs. They now have been advised to take the dogs directly to the kennel where they will remain until the owner proves that the dog has been vaccinated and licensed. Owners will be responsible for kennel fees and fines. Please do the right thing and get your dog licensed for the safety of the community and your pet.

The fall crisp air of the changing season has made us aware that winter is not far off. The Selectboard met with Highway Boss David Brooks and went over some changes that we think are necessary for the safety of everyone who uses the salt shed. Salt cost this year has increased by 17% which will cause about a \$5,000.00 increase for Leyden.

During storms, heavy equipment and bad lighting near the shed and highway garage have made for some close calls when residents have been loading their containers. This year we will be putting a small shed out in front of Town Hall from which to fill your containers. David will keep it stocked with the mixture of salt and sand for the personal use of town residents.

WiredWest

Have you ever noticed how many utility poles there are on any given stretch of road? WiredWest continues to work with Mass. Broadband as it moves ahead to get over 60,000 of those poles ready for fiber, and to help our towns with financing issues. We are part of a truly historic project, the biggest of its kind in the country, connecting western MA hill towns to sustainable broadband for the foreseeable future. Major newspapers, The Wall Street Journal and the Boston Globe among others, are writing about what we are doing. It is clear that quality broadband will have a huge economic impact for this whole region, so we are being watched very closely by economists.

The new Leyden Broadband Committee met for the first time on September 8th. Bob Ryan chairs the group, with Tom Luck, Dave Curtis, and Bob Anson as voting members. Jeff Neipp for the Selectboard and Al Woodhull and Sheila Hourihan, Leyden's delegates to WiredWest, are non-voting members. We had a long meeting on Sept. 23rd with two representatives from Crocker Communications. Our second committee meeting was on Oct. 6th. We will meet with a couple of other for-profit groups who want to tell us what they think they can do for Leyden as service providers. We will keep you informed as we continue to meet.

WiredWest is still taking the pre-commitment forms which indicate that you want fiber to your home. We are either very close to, or over the 40% count that we hope to have as an indicator of strong interest in each town; we expect those numbers to grow much higher as this project progresses. If you have not already sent in your refundable \$49 fee, please go to wiredwest.net to fill out the application online or for a copy you can mail in with a check.
