

Broadband Committee

Broadband is Getting Closer!

The Broadband Committee has been moving full steam ahead and we believe that Leyden will be included in the State's next group of towns approved to begin broadband implementation. This means we will begin an MBI paid pole survey as early as December, with wiring underway by this time next year. It is going to happen!

MBI has hired Osmose Utilities Services Inc. to act as Project Manager on our behalf. Over a 30-day period they will collect all of the necessary field data for our 800+ poles and complete the necessary utility company applications for an estimate on what it will cost to prepare the poles for our new fiber line. You will see "Osmose Utility Services, Inc." trucks in Leyden in December, if not sooner!

Once we agree on an overall dollar number, we will sign the necessary paperwork to actually start making the poles ready. At that point, late March of 2017, MBI will require \$321,000 as the first of three payments to cover Leyden's share of the total project.

The Broadband Committee, with the support of the Selectboard and Finance Committee, has asked that an article be added to the warrant of the planned **Special Town Meeting** on <u>Monday, November 14th</u> to make available for pending Broadband needs the \$62,911 that was added to the Technology Stabilization Fund at last May's Annual Town Meeting. Approximately \$20,000 of this money will be used in January 2017 to cover the application fees required by the utility companies and the remainder will be used in March of 2017 as part of the first payment of \$321,000 due to MBI. (The remainder of MBI's first payment will be covered from Bond Financing.)

The Broadband Committee will host a **Town Broadband Forum** on <u>Thursday, November 10^{th} at 7:00 pm at Town Hall to talk about the Broadband implementation schedule and cost involved. We invite you to join us then and hopefully we will be able to answer any questions you might have.</u>

WiredWest

We hope all of you were able to read the front page article in the *Recorder* on October 12^{th} to get a sense of what is being done by WiredWest to prepare for broadband after the buildout is finished. In the meantime, we continue to help our towns navigate the readiness requirements for MBI.

Most important right now is the forum that the Broadband Committee will hold on <u>Thursday, November 10th</u> at 7:00 PM in Town Hall. Please make every effort to attend that meeting. Things are beginning to move very fast, as you can see in Bob Ryan's article for the Broadband Committee which includes more detailed information. After years of waiting, you can attend the forum to have your questions answered and to find out what you will see around town in the very near future.

We would like to thank the Broadband Committee, especially Bob Ryan, for the work that has been done to meet all the readiness requirements. It has involved a lot of paperwork, as well as discussions with our Town Counsel and Town Auditor. Al Woodhull and Sheila Hourihan, as WiredWest delegates, are also members of the Broadband Committee. We have seen firsthand all the work it has taken to get us to this point. Our Select Board and Finance Committee also deserve much credit for having kept Leyden on a sound financial track. That has enabled us to move forward quickly. Other towns have not been so fortunate. We are truly on the move now to realize our vision for this infrastructure project that will help keep our towns vital.
