The Town has now received detailed drawings of how fiber will be connected to each home in Leyden, and we are in the process of bidding out a construction contract to hang 35 miles of fiber to the curb of every home in Leyden. Accurate site information is vital to the overall success of our town-owned, fiber-optic network! To that end, we are asking all town residents over the next three weeks to verify the information that has been collected about your property. It is especially important if you are one of the 140 households with a long driveway, underground utilities, or other special site considerations.

We will be available downstairs at Town Hall between 2-5 PM on the following Tuesdays: May 22nd, May 29th and June 5th or between 5-8 PM on the following Thursday evenings: May 24th, May 31st and June 7th. This is your best chance to verify the information we have on your property. The more accurate the information, the better, faster, and more cost effective this project will be. Please stop by and help us out.

The new year will see us starting the search for a new Administrative Assistant. As many of you have heard, Bob Hardesty has decided to retire this fall. As this is my last newsletter, as Chair, I'll take the time to personally thank Bob for his dedicated service to the Town and the extraordinary help he has been to me, making this year as chair a breeze. Bob, I give you my personal thanks and wish you only the best.

The Select Board has declared several pieces of equipment as surplus and has asked Dan Galvis to put them up for sale online. Any funds received will go to the General Fund of the Town, and will be seen in our free cash next year.

David Brooks has been able to obtain a used Ford pickup with an eight-foot plow and sander. It will allow us to plow the Simeon Keets Road bridge and allow greater flexibility in doing routine work around town. The smaller but versatile truck should reduce wear and tear on the bigger trucks and save on operational cost of the fleet. We should be able to proceed with guard rail work on Brattleboro road as Verizon has finally removed the old poles.

Your Recreation Committee has been busy down at the Avery Field pavilion, repairing the tables and doing plumbing repairs, mowing exterior areas and general cleanup. Special thanks go to Sue Howarth for organizing events and her super vision in seeing what's possible. John Higgins has been instrumental in helping Sue with event planning and putting his carpentry skill to work. Thank you, John. Brian Pelletier has spent hours doing various things from carpentry to plumbing to get the facilities ready for summer. Brian, I personally appreciate all that you do. 

with Verizon and Eversource, the State released \$220,000 of grant monies to the Town. This brings the amount received to date to \$532,000 of the \$680,000 promised, with another \$130,000 expected within the next 45 days. To date \$55,000 of state money has been paid out for design engineering, pole applications and surety bonds.

• Four bidders so far are interested in the initial phase of network construction, which will likely begin in early 2019, or perhaps sooner if the utility companies have made room on their poles for the new fiber-optic wires.

The week before the swap, dig up your plants, collect seeds, divide bulbs, set them in containers, and *water them!*Label each plant item with the plant name, preferred light conditions, and height.

Bring your plants, seeds, etc., to the Green by 10:15 AM on Sunday, June 10, 2018.

This will give you time to set up and browse.
