Broadband Committee Additional Grant Money Awarded

The Broadband Committee has just received the good news that Leyden has been awarded \$260,000 in new grant money to help with broadband expenses.

The Town is part of a 20-town consortium managed by Westfield Gas & Electric, which was formed for the sole purpose of applying for a broadband development grant available under the FCC's Connect America Fund.

Grants under this fund are intended to encourage broadband development in unserved rural areas across the country. The money will be used to offset some of the capital cost involved in building our broadband network. The western MA consortium was awarded a grant of \$1 million/year for each of the next 10 years. Leyden's share of the grant award will be \$26,000/year for each of the next 10 years (\$260,000 in total) with no strings attached.

This program is modeled after similar programs used early in the 20th century to bring electricity and telephone to rural America and the ones used in the 50's and 60's to build the interstate highway system.
