Reports to: COA Board of Directors

Job Description:

Help to recruit and organize volunteers for various aspects of the program. Take attendance and keep statistics for lunches and programs. Keep COA files in order. Inventory supplies for lunches and other programs. Help set up and clean up lunches and other programs. Assist in arranging programs, making phone calls, confirming dates and times, and communicating closely with board members to avoid scheduling conflicts. Develop flyers and reminders about upcoming lunches and programs. Attend monthly COA Board meetings. Must be available to accommodate the various scheduled COA programs. Other tasks that may come up as needed for the smooth operation of all COA programs.

Qualifications: Cheerful, well organized and able to work with elders and volunteers. Have good communication skills, computer experience, and be able to stand for periods of time and have the ability to lift 10 to 15 pounds.

FRTA comes to Leyden! ~ Beginning on the first of January, FRTA (Franklin Regional Transit Authority) has begun on-demand, limited service to Leyden for those over age 60, or who are handicapped. Before being able to use the service, residents must fill out an application form, available at Town Hall (or by calling FRTA at 413-774-2262 or download it from their website: www.frtc.org) and attach a photo copy of a valid driver's license and send it in to FRTA. (The address is on the application.) There is a one-way fee of \$2.75, which is payable in exact change or with a FRTA prepaid card. No checks or credit cards are accepted. For someone who needs a care-giver, the one-way fee for that person is \$.75. FRTA needs a 48 hour notice. The busses are wheelchair accessible. As of the 17th of December, if you have filled out forms and been approved, they will begin taking ride requests for transportation to go to doctor appointments or grocery shopping in Greenfield. More information is available on the website and at Town Hall.

Learn to use the Potter's Wheel


Learn a new skill, learn to use the potter's wheel!
