Select Board Report

On May 16th the School Committee held their meeting at the Leyden Town Hall. The main topic was to reconsider the closure of the Warwick Community School. The vote failed. In our opinion the school committee has again failed to meet the necessary steps to address the emergency legislation passed last year to help the PVRSD get out of debt.

At our Annual Town Meeting on May 18th we postponed indefinitely our assessment to fund the PVRSD schools in hopes that the school committee would make the right choice by closing the Warwick school to help with future financial stability of the district. Since this failed the four towns Selectboards and Finance Committees will meet again on June 3rd to discuss further options. All four towns will be holding Special Town Meetings on **Monday, June 17 at 7pm**. At this point there is no guarantee that the recommended school budget approved by the school committee will pass.

Leyden is still looking at a \$53,000 increase over last year even with our school closing. This was not the plan we were hoping for and is causing great concern amongst all four towns that this is not affordable even at the low percentage increase. Unfortunately, we cannot rely on possible school choice children attending the schools to help fund the budget. Over 60% of the town's yearly budget goes to the schools and we cannot continue to maintain these increases.

We encourage all voting residents to attend the June 17th meeting, hear all the facts and have an open discussion regarding the PVRSD school budget before we vote.

The board reorganized on Monday, May 20th. Jeff Neipp is the chair for the coming year.

Michele's Award Winning Lemon Yogurt Cake Recipe from Ina Garten READY IN: 1hr 10mins SERVES: 8

INGREDIENTS

1 ¹/₂ cups all-purpose flower 2 tsp baking powder ¹/₂ tsp kosher salt 1 cup plain yogurt 1 ¹/₃ cups sugar, divided 3 extra-large eggs 2 tsp lemon zest, grated zest of 2 lemons ¹/₂ tsp pure vanilla extract ¹/₂ cup vegetable oil ¹/₃ cup fresh lemon juice

For the Glaze

1 cup confectioners' sugar 2 tbs fresh lemon juice

DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease an 8 1/2 by 4 1/4 by 2 1/2-inch loaf pan. Line the bottom with parchment paper. Grease and flour the pan. Sift together the flour, baking powder, and salt into 1 bowl. In another bowl, whisk together the yogurt, 1 cup sugar, the eggs, lemon zest, and vanilla. Slowly whisk the dry ingredients into the wet ingredients. With a rubber spatula, fold the vegetable oil into the batter, making sure it's all incorporated. Pour the batter into the prepared pan and bake for about 50 minutes, or until a cake tester placed in the center of the loaf comes out clean. Meanwhile, cook the 1/3 cup lemon juice and remaining 1/3 cup sugar in a small pan until the sugar dissolves and the mixture is clear. Set the lemon syrup aside. When the cake is done, allow it to cool in the pan for 10 minutes. Carefully place on a baking rack over a sheet pan. While the cake is still warm, pour the lemonsugar syrup over the cake and allow it to soak inches Cool. For the glaze, combine the confectioners' sugar and lemon juice and pour over the cake.
